Early in January, 69 "Warming Rooms" were established in all districts of Vienna by the City Government with the assistance of the Allies. Seventeen are located in the U.S. Area. This program has been successful from its inception. The Allied Powers have allocated 72 tons of coal per month for heating these rooms. The Vienna Inter-Allied Public Welfare Committee has approved the opening of 26 more warming rooms. These are designated primarily for mothers with small children. Rooms already in existence will then be given chiefly to aged people, who suffer most from cold. Welfare agencies of the city of Vienna provide coffee for the warming rooms. Newspapers are also supplied.

EMERGENCY SUPPLEMENTARY SCHOOL FEEDING

This program in schools and kindergartens continued to furnish over 100,000 Viennese school children a supplementary daily lunch of approximately 385 calories. The meal consisted of thick soup and a roll each school day, with a cake once a week. The Allied Powers contribute food to this program.
